Also include at least five high resolution pictures of the athlete competing at an SASP event, practice or with other SASP athletes. Return signed release on next page.

All submissions will be reviewed by the SASP Staff and a review committee. The top three stories with the most significant and clearly explained personal impacts will win one of the following prizes.

1st Place - Certificate for a Glock Pistol

3rd Place – Walker hearing protection
